Sandpoint recorded a -19 on January 13<sup>th</sup>, but it was at least two degrees colder at my house. Just for the record, the coldest overnight in Sandpoint was recorded on December 30, 1968, at negative 37. The cold weather had a negligible effect on District operations except we noticed an above average increase in January inflows. Could it be that people were continuously running a little water through their faucets to ward off frozen pipes? Seems possible.

**Welcome, Julie Houske.** The Board has appointed Julie Houske to replace retiring board member Jack Lensing. Julie and her husband, Chip, have owned the Bottle Bay Marina since 2001. Reaching the District for Service. There's been some confusion and difficulty in calling the District for service and billing questions. The Board has taken two steps to remedy the situation: first, our District phone number is now the service line for our licensed operator, Water Systems Management (WSM). WSM monitors the line 24-7. The appropriate District representative will get back to you promptly. Second, in case you don't have the WSM phone number handy when you need it, we've enclosed a sticker to be



placed on your pump control unit. There's another sticker to be placed on the inside of your switch panel to remind everyone to leave the septic pump circuit breaker on at all times.

**Constructing on your Property?** A reminder that if you are constructing a new home or doing substantial remodeling with additional bedrooms, living quarters or an RV pad with a sewer connection, you will need a Sewer Permit from the District.
